## [A new release of the PROMT app for mobile devices – By Konstantin Dranch](#)

[PROMT](#), the Russian provider of machine translation software, has released an update of its mobile application, [Translate](#). Release 1.2 features a new interface for the iPad screen.

PROMT has already released Apple OS and Android apps for tablets and smartphones. The new app comes in for free or in a paid variant with no advertising.

The first version had been released only a few months ago, in December 2011, while Microsoft and Google have published the mobile versions of their machine translation software quite earlier.

Users has welcomed the PROMT app with an average of 4.5 on the Android market, and a 4+ on iTunes.

PROMT's app exploits a rule-based machine translation engine that currently supports 47 language pairs. 25 pairs are available online at [translate.ru](#).

As you can see underneath, the tests from English to Russian have been fairly satisfactory.





However, much must still be done with language pairs that do not include Russian. For example, our English to Italian tests resulted in poor translations.
